We miss you! We can't wait to welcome you back as soon as possible. Please keep working hard on all the lessons your teachers are working hard to create and stay healthy!

To help make sure we have everything ready to go for next year, please read through this information. Our plan for selecting options for next year is outlined below. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns. We are here to help!

## **What you need to know and do - the short answer:**

1. Between today and May 8<sup>th</sup> – read through this information and watch the instructional PowerPoint (Option Selection Tutorial) found here: <https://sjf.lethsd.ab.ca/parents/registration>.
2. Between May 8<sup>th</sup> and May 15<sup>th</sup> – use your parent (or student) PowerSchool login and follow the instructions from the PowerPoint on the website to select the options you'd like next year. We've simplified the choices so don't worry if you don't see the same options we've offered in the past.

## **What you need to know and do - the long answer:**

### Part 1 – Registration (The boring part)

Typically, around this time you get a pile of paperwork full of contact information and permission forms to fill out and return to the school. Not this year! Our school division is working on an online registration package that will streamline the process. We will let you know when that is up and running. In the meantime, don't worry about that part of things. We have all the important demographic information we need to get started.

### Part 2 – Option Selection (The fun part)

First, take a few minutes to talk with your Falcon about the different option classes they may want to explore. The descriptions of the courses offered are at the end of this letter. Keep in mind, this process does not prioritize preferred options. Selecting more options than required is better than selecting fewer. It helps create flexibility if some options fill up before others. Otherwise, students may be placed in options in which they have no interest. Although there are opportunities to change options at certain points throughout the year, the fewer changes we have to make once classes start, the better. Then, sometime between May 8<sup>th</sup> and May 15<sup>th</sup>, follow the instructions from the PowerPoint and select options for next year.

### General Guidelines for Options:

- Review the options descriptions and decide which ones are of interest.
- The school year is divided into 3 terms, each term having 2 option blocks. This means students could potentially have six different options each year.
- Band is a FULL YEAR option. This means Band will take up 3 of the 6 option blocks.
- Some options have a supplementary fee to cover material and supply costs.
- Option courses will be selected through parent PowerSchool logins.
- The Option selections window will be from May 8<sup>th</sup> to May 15<sup>th</sup>.

## 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY COMMUNICATIONS

Communications in the 21<sup>st</sup> century has changed radically over the past twenty years. Students are exposed to new video, audio, text and multi-media communications everyday. Through module projects, learn how to select credible information from online, satellite, and wireless sources and create effective communication pieces using video, audio, print media and online productions tools.

## ART

“This world is but a canvas to our imagination.” – Henry David Thoreau. If you love to create and design, this class is for you! As an artist, you will explore a variety of art techniques and tools through drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture, fabric arts, photography and digital design. You will create art by focusing on the elements and principles of design for good composition in your own work and by encountering the art of others.

Course Fee: \$15.00 (supplies and materials)

## BAND



This option continues to focus and extend on the fundamentals of wind & percussion instruments. Through individual growth and co-operative group interaction, students become confident musicians. Goals of the program include learning to play an instrument, learning to read music, learning music theory and participating in public performances.

Additional costs: Most students will privately rent from a local music store (flute, clarinet, alto/tenor saxophones, trumpet and trombone). Percussion and larger instruments are rented from the school for a fee of \$90.00. All students pay an option fee of \$15.00 which includes a method book and folder that will be used for the year.

## CHORAL

Come as you are and make music with us! We'll sing a wide variety of music, including current hits you've heard on the radio...and classics your parents and grandparents might have heard too!

Course Fee: \$15.00 (supplies and materials)

## DANCE

We will explore a variety of styles including, Jazz, Lyrical, Bollywood, Broadway, Ballet, and more! You will improve your flexibility, balance, stamina, cardiovascular fitness, coordination and confidence. Students will have the opportunity to choreograph their own number as a solo or in a small group. *This class is suitable for all levels of dancers, from beginners to advanced.*

## DRAMA

In this class we will work together as a group to explore the joys of theatre. This will include movement, speech and acting as well as technical theatre to make props, design sets and run lights and sounds. Depending on class interests we will explore theatre through mime, clowning, children's theatre, puppetry and more! If you enjoy *any* aspect of theatre, this option is for you!



## FOODS

Do you like food? We like food! This option will introduce you to all things culinary. Learn to talk like a chef, cook like a chef, and eat like a pro! Students will work in groups to create culinary masterpieces and learn about food, kitchen safety, nutrition, simple meal planning, and food preparation techniques. By the end of this option you'll be "bacon" to be in the kitchen!



Course Fee: \$20.00 (materials and supplies)

## FRENCH

*I'm getting better at communicating in French.* We will discuss and write about familiar topics, such as school subjects and activities, the weather, and friends. We will compare different Francophone cultures. Students will also decide how to correctly address people and when to use formal or informal language, and they will correctly write addresses and telephone numbers in French.

## **MODERN LANGUAGES = GERMAN + FRENCH**

If you enjoyed learning Spanish and/or German last year or have an interest in different languages and cultures around the world, this class is for you. Explore different ways people communicate and interact based on unique cultures and histories and learn how they influence how we communicate and interact as well.

## **INTRO TO GUITAR**

This class is an “intro” to playing the guitar. No previous guitar experience required. Through individual growth and co-operative group interaction, students become confident musicians. Students will learn the fundamentals of music notation, parts of the guitar and proper playing technique leading into fundamental chords. Styles will vary from classical to rock and a bit of everything in between. The class will have performance opportunities in the school at term end celebrations.

Course Fee: \$10:00 (materials and supplies)

## **GUITAR**

The grade 7 class is a continuation of the grade 6 class. More advanced techniques and extended ranges in playing will be explored. An importance will be placed on more advanced rhythms and sight-reading. The class will perform in term end celebration concerts. ***Pre-requisite: Grade 6 guitar or Grade 7 intro to guitar.***

Course Fee: \$10.00 (materials and supplies)

## **INDUSTRIAL ARTS - CONSTRUCTION**

Students develop basic hand tool and machine skills to design and build useful projects from solid wood and composite materials. Students will design and build their own custom projects.

Course Fee: \$30.00 (material and consumable costs)



## **SEWING**

Learn about the world of fashion, fabric and design! In this option, students will practice the basics of machine assisted sewing while completing different sewing tasks and projects. Course fee does not include materials.

## **YEARBOOK**

Be a part of preserving the best memories of the school year by creating our school’s yearbook. In this product focused class, you will explore elements of graphic design, composition, photography, and community building.
