ii.) Craig Whitehead (Trustee)

- → New Superintendent, Mike Nightingale was announced on May 23rd. He has worked as a teacher, associate principal, principal and central office administrator for three school divisions over the past 23 years. He has been serving in the Lethbridge School Division since August of 2020 as Associate Superintendent of Human Resources.
- ightarrow City has decided to unify the school zone speed limit, they will always be 'playground zones.'
- → Kaylee's presentation to the school board helped the board to agree on starting as Ad Hoc committee on technology use. Students, parenting, and teachers would like cell phones in the lockers. This fall they will begin surveys and finding volunteers for the committee.
- \rightarrow 32 people retiring out of the Division, 17 support and 15 teachers.

- → Our Division has 160 policies and the majority of other Divisions have about 30. They are hoping to clean up policies and instead have more procedures. (Procedures should support the policies).
