Dear Parents/Guardians,

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Lethbridge and District is offering a mentor led group-based program for students in Grade 6. This program is called **Game On!/Go Girls.** The program consists of facilitated sessions held over a 6-week period at the school. A schedule with exact dates and times will be sent home with your child prior to or on the first day of program. We are happy to be able to provide **lunch** for the youth in our programs, but are limited in our ability to accommodate all dietary restrictions.

GoGirls!/GameOn! is a group program that incorporates fun, educational games and activities designed to stimulate self-reflection and group discussion. The goal of this program is to provide your child with information and support to make informed choices about healthy lifestyles, mental and physical health, self-esteem, and communication skills.

Informed Consent (Site Based group program) - Parent

I hereby give permission to Big Brothers Big Sisters of Lethbridge and District to make available their service to my child. It is my understanding that the intention of the Agency is to offer my child an opportunity to participate in a group program lead by a responsible adult, (minimum 18 years old, however, where appropriate supervision takes place, the volunteer may be younger), I understand that all efforts will be made to select a responsible Mentor who will facilitate the group program. In consideration for this service and other valuable consideration provided to my child by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Lethbridge and District, I release the agency of all responsibilities and liabilities in connection to their services provided in good faith, to myself or my child. I permit the agency to release any relevant information, including my personal information, to Big Brothers Big Sisters of Canada and their insurers, as may be appropriate in connection with any legal proceeding, inquiry or risk thereof. I understand that the collection of personal information about me or my child will be held in strict confidence and is to be used solely for the purposes of administering the program. I further agree that information about my child may be shared, at the discretion of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Lethbridge and District, with the group facilitator so that my child's needs may be best met. I understand that this application is the property of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Lethbridge and District. I also agree that my child will participate in the Pre-Match Training Program administered by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Lethbridge and District.



Hanukkah (Jewish)



Dec 7-15- This Festival of Lights is celebrated for eight days. It begins previous sundown at 6pm.

Approximately in 164 B.C.,

Maccabees, a small group of Jews fighting for religious freedom won victory over the Syrians. The legend goes to rededicate the temple, they found only one jar of holy oil and miraculously the candelabra remained lit for 8 days. An 8 candle menorah is lit.

Bodhi Day (Buddhist)

Dec 8- In Japanese Zen, Bodhi
Day is called "Rohatsu" and is the
observance of enlightenment of
the historical Buddha. Zen
monasteries observe this day
with a meditation retreat lasting
several days. On the last night of
a Rohatsu sesshin, monks and
students often sit in meditation
until dawn, as the Buddha did 25
centuries ago.

Pošadaš (Mexico)



Dec 16-24- A nine-day traditional celebration throughout Mexico. Processions of pilgrims go door to door asking for posada, which means shelter, commemorating the search by Mary and Joseph for shelter.



Yule (Wicca)


Dec 22- During the winter solstice – the longest night of the year, the rebirth of the sun which is life sustaining is celebrated. The Yule tree is decorated with fruit and candles are lit to represent the sun.

Christmas Day (Christian)




Dec 25- This day celebrates Jesus Christ's birth over 2000 years ago. Customs include lighting candles, exchanging gifts and using evergreen decorations to celebrate this day, the most widely observed Christian festival of the year. In most communities it is a family day.



Kwanzaa (African-American/Canada, USA)

Dec 26- A professor who wanted to encourage African Americans to celebrate their heritage started Kwanzaa's in California in 1966.
Kwanzaa means first fruit in Swahili and is a harvest festival. Families exchange gifts and have African-style feasts. Seven-pronged candleholders are lit on each consecutive night for the seven principles: unity, self-determination, working together, sharing, purpose, creativity and faith. The celebration continues till January







Dec 2023

Rizal Day (Philippines)



Dec 30- This day commemorates the death of Jose Mercado rizal in 1896, a Philippine doctor and author whose books denounced Spanish administration. He was an inspiration to the Philippine nationalist movement.



Omisoka (Japan)

Dec 31- To usher in the new year, families clean their homes, eat toshikoshi buckwheat noodles in the hope that one's life will be stretched out as long as these noodles. As midnight approaches, Shinto temples around the country begin ringing out the old year, sounding the temple bell 108 times, signifying the 108 human worldly desires removed by the striking of the bell. Most offices are closed Dec 30 - Jan 4 or Dec 29 - Jan 3.





INDIGENOUS INNOVATION HIGHLIGHT!

Aaron Yazzie

Navajo, Arizona

Mechanical Systems Engineer at NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory



Aaron Yazzie was born on the Navajo Reservation in Tuba City, Arizona in 1986.

He is currently a mechanical engineer at the NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California, where he designs mechanical systems for robotic space research missions.

He has worked extensively on flight hardware for missions to Mars, including the Curiosity Rover and the Perseverance Rover.

In 2017, Yazzie was honored by the Navajo Nation Tribal Council for "contributions to service and inspiration to Diné [Navajo] youth and citizens," and he received the NASA JPL Bruce Murray Award in 2019 for "promoting inclusion and excitement in science and education especially among Indigenous Communities."


