The sun is shining, the days are longer, and the final stretch of the school year is here!




🚗 Parking Safety Reminder 🚗

WELCOME TO GLAGGLELAND: A LEGO ADVENTURE BY ZACKERY ROBERTSON

If you've walked by the Learning Commons lately, you might have noticed a wild and wonderful LEGO world on display—and it's not your average brick build. Grade 6 student Zackery Robertson has brought Glaggleland to life, a theme park inspired by the kidfriendly parts of Glaggleland, a silly internet meme world known for its strange creatures and theme park rides, and let's just say...it's full of imagination, humor, and Gigglers.

Glaggleland is a wacky internet creation known for its out-there rides and bizarre lore. Zackery decided to take on the challenge of recreating it in LEGO form. "I was inspired by the different creatures, cultures, and rides of Glaggleland," he says. And what a ride it is!

Zackery's build features wild roller coasters, colorful characters, and a magical zone called Blumper Forest, his favorite part of the park. "It's a forest with little creatures running around. They come in all different sizes," he explains.

While Glaggleland originally existed as someone else's creation, Zackery put his own spin on it. He spent over four days building this epic LEGO version, and although it's still a work in progress, it's already a hit with students and staff alike.

When asked why he thinks creativity is important, Zackery put it perfectly:

"I think it's important for kids to be creative because they can make something, and it could take them somewhere they never thought they'd end up."

Well said, Zackery. Glaggleland may have started as an internet meme—but here at our school, it's a showcase of imagination, innovation, and one seriously cool kid.



First Responder to Sexual Abuse TrainingTM This


